D-Day veterans to receive France's highest honour

The Government of France wishes to recognise the selfless acts of heroism and determination displayed by all surviving veterans of the Normandy landings, and of the wider campaigns to liberate France in 1944, by awarding them with the Legion d'Honneur. The Legion is working with the Ministry of Defence (MOD) to bring to the attention of all D-Day veterans their eligibility for this award.

This recognition extends beyond the troops who actually landed on and fought their way up the beaches 70 years ago, and will include Royal Navy and Royal Air Force personnel who operated in support of the landings.

Those who are eligible for the award can make their request using this application form. It will be processed by MOD, who will forward the details to the French authorities. The French authorities will then make the final decisions on the awards.
